Master's Programme in Economics is organized by [the School of Business](#). The programme is structured to ensure internationally comparable qualifications and a lifelong human capital. The programme is particularly strong in the areas of Applied Microeconomics and International Economics (including Development Economics). A long-term cooperative arrangement between the Department of Economics at the School of Business, the Discipline of Economics at the University of Helsinki and Department of Economics at Hanken School of Economics allows the students to choose from a wide selection of advanced specialisation courses.
